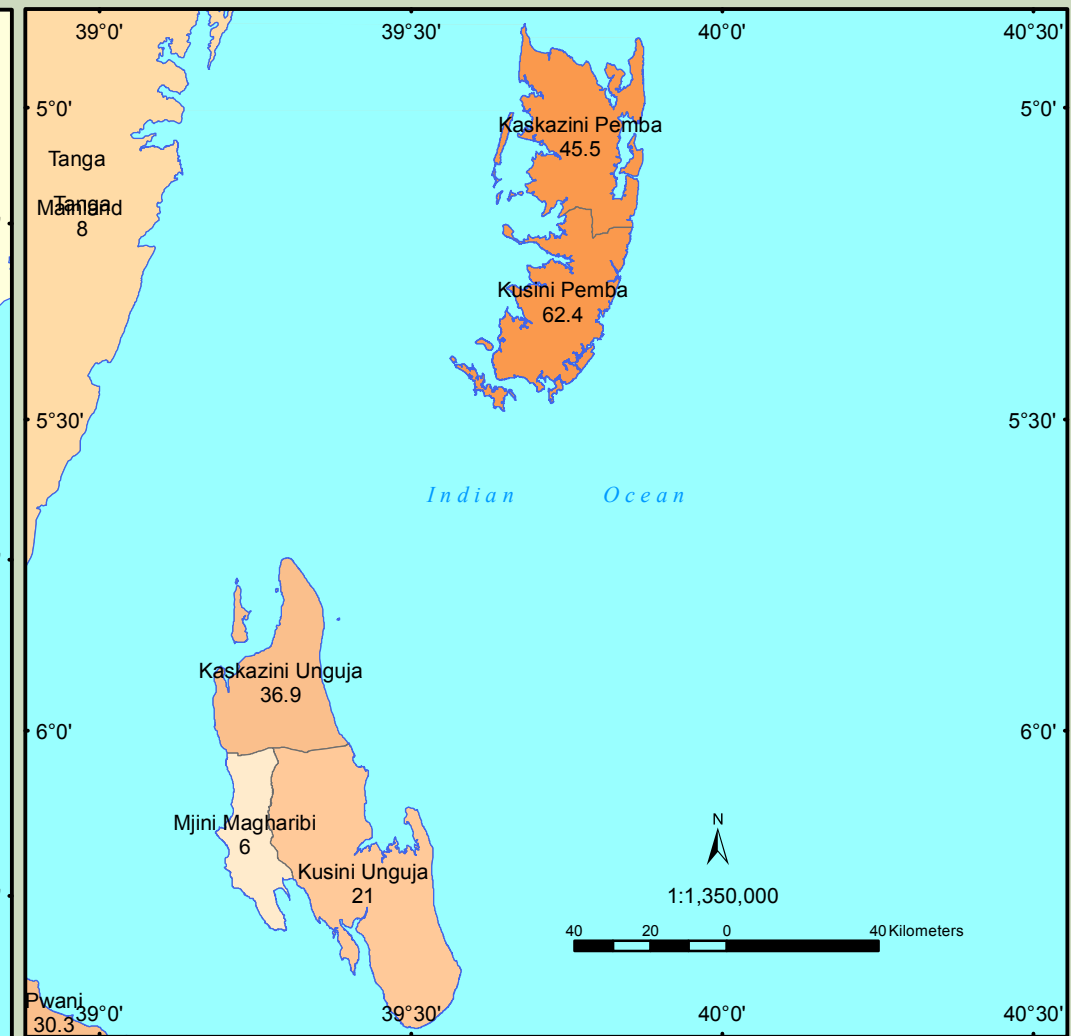
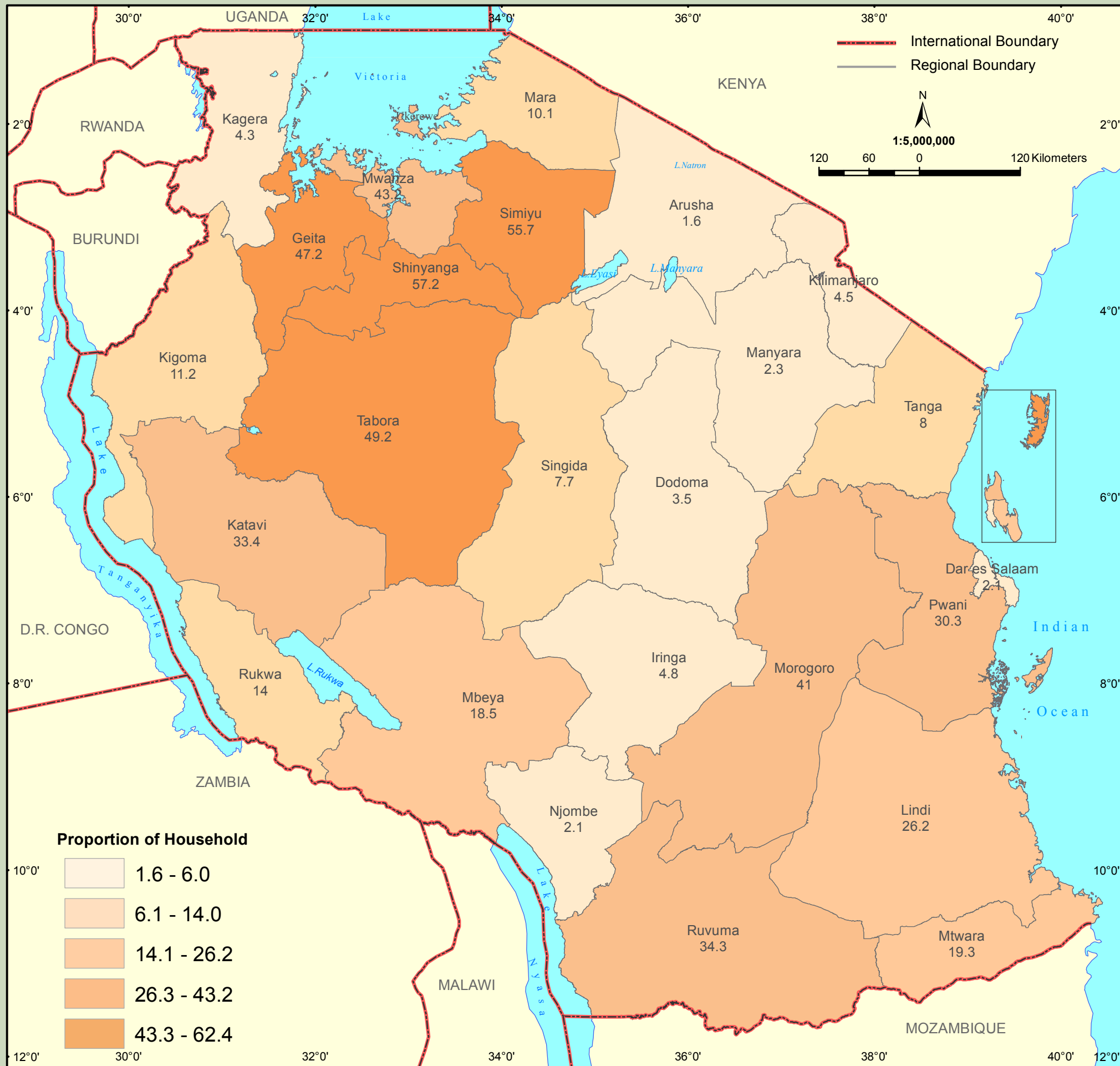


# Proportion of private households growing paddy



A private household was defined as a person or group of persons who reside in the same homestead or compound but not necessarily in the same dwelling unit, having the same cooking arrangements, and are answerable to the same household head. Private households constituted about 99 percent of all households, suggesting that the remaining one percent of all households were collective households. About 19 percent (18.6) of all private households were growing paddy. A sizeable proportion of private households in Kusini Pemba (62.4), Shinyanga (57.2) and Simiyu (55.7) were reported to grow paddy. Regions which lie along the Rift Valley were found to be the least regions which grow paddy. Such regions were Arusha (1.6), Njombe (2.1), Manyara (2.3), Dodoma (3.5), Iringa (4.8) and Singida (7.7). Other regions which lie outside the Great Rift Valley that were the least growers of paddy include Dar es Salaam (2.1), Kagera (4.3), Kilimanjaro (4.5) and Mjini Magharibi (6.0).
