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## QUARTERLY GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT SECOND QUARTER 2011

#### 1.0 Introduction

This report presents the official Quarterly Gross Domestic Product (QGDP) estimates for Tanzania Mainland. The compilation of QGDP follows the need of having appropriate policy interventions which can be achieved through reliable and frequent reports on recent economic developments. The current quarterly GDP estimates may be revised on the availability of the revised data from the field.

#### 1.1 Economic Performance

In the report, the real growth rates are measured as percentage changes of QGDP for current year as compared to the QGDP for the previous year. The real growth rate for the second quarter of the year 2011 is the percentage change between QGDP of the second quarter of the year 2010 and the corresponding figure for the year 2011.

The Real Gross Domestic Product at market prices is estimated to have increased at a growth rate of 6.7 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to growth rate of 7.2 percent in the second quarter of 2010.



In absolute terms, the QGDP for the quarter under review was 4,425,551 million shillings in 2011 compared to 4,149,480 million shillings in 2010, (Annex 1)




Figure 1: Growth Rates for the Second Quarter, 2002-2011


## 2. 0 Agriculture

The activity registered a growth rate of 3.5 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 2.9 percent registered in the same quarter of 2010.

The increase in growth rate was due to the increase in the harvest of major food crops. The quantity of maize harvested went up by 25.0 percent from 2,597 thousand tonnes in the second quarter of

2010 to 3,246 thousand tonnes in the corresponding quarter of 2011. Paddy harvested increased by 23 percent from 352 thousand tonnes in the second quarter of 2010 to 432 thousand tonnes in the same quarter of 2011. Millet/Sorghum harvested in the second quarter of 2010 was 308 thousand tonnes compared to 333 thousand tonnes in the corresponding quarter of 2011 which is an increase of 8.0 percent, while Cassava harvested increased by 30.0 percent from 1,071 thousand tonnes in the second quarter of 2010 to 1,392 thousand tonnes in the second quarter of 2011.

Figure 2: Production / Harvested Quantity of Selected Major Crops for the Second Quarter 2010 – 2011




#### 3.0 Fishing

Fishing recorded a growth rate of 0.7 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 1.9 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2010. The growth rate is mainly attributed to slight increase of demand for fish and fish products both at local and foreign markets.

#### 4.0 Mining and Quarrying

The activity recorded a growth rate of 5.8 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to a growth rate of 20.5 percent in the second quarter of 2010. The growth rate was due to slight increase in Gold, Diamond and Tanzanite production for the second quarter of the year 2011.

Figure 3: Growth Rates for Mining and Quarrying, Second Quarter 2002-2011




#### 5.0 Manufacturing

The activity recorded a growth rate of 6.2 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 7.5 percent in 2010. The growth rate for this activity was due to slight increase in the index of industrial production from 178.6 in the second quarter of 2010 to 189.3 in the second quarter of 2011 which was a result of unreliable electricity power supply in the country which also affected manufacturing establishments.

Slight increases were recorded in the manufacture of chemicals, textiles, cement, processed food and other food products, such that, the volume index of chemicals increased from 338 in the second quarter of 2010 to 449 in second quarter of 2011, while the volume index of textiles had slightly increased from 185 in the second quarter of 2010 to 202 in second quarter of 2011. The index of manufacturing of cement increased from 224 percent in the second quarter of 2010 to 271 percent in the second quarter of 2011. The volume index of processed food increased from 129 percent in the second quarter of 2010 to 132 percent in the second quarter of 2011 whereas; volume index of other food products increased from 200 percent in the second quarter of 2010 to 182 percent in the second quarter of 2011.

### 6.0 Electricity and Water

The growth rate of electricity was 3.1 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 10.1 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2010. The slight growth rate was attributed to shortage of rainfall especially in the hydro dam catchment's areas and the servicing of the gas turbines during the period.

#### 7.0 Construction

Construction activity grew at a rate of 25.4 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to a growth rate of 24.0 percent in the second quarter of 2010; the growth rate is attributed to increase in the construction of residential and non-residential buildings, roads

and bridges; and land improvement activities during the reference period.

# 8.0 Wholesale and Retail Trade; Repair of Motor Vehicles, Motorcycles, Personal and Household Goods

This activity recorded a growth of 6.0 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compare to 9.6 percent in the second quarter of 2010. The growth rate is attributed to a slight increase in traded domestic manufactured goods and imports of merchandized goods in the period under review. During the period, trade turnover increased from Shs. 1,034,997 million in the second quarter of 2010 to Shs. 1,262,838 million in the same quarter in 2011.

#### 9.0 Hotels and Restaurants

Hotels and restaurants recorded a growth rate of 2.4 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 7.3 percent in the second quarter of 2010. The growth rate is attributed to slight increase in the number of international and resident visitors in hotels. The overall international bed occupancy increased from 150,285 in the second quarter of 2010 to 151,109 in the same quarter of 2011, while the domestic bed occupancy increased from 132,168 in the first quarter of 2010 to 135,194 in the same quarter of 2011.

## 10.0 Transport and Communication

The activity recorded a growth rate of 12.7 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 6.6 percent in the second quarter of 2010. The performance is attributed to an increase in the number of passengers carried and cargo/freight handled for almost all modes of transport and increased airtime used by cell phones customers during the period under review.

#### 11.0 Financial Intermediation

The activity recorded a growth rate of 11.6 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 14.6 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2010. The performance is attributed slight increase in levels of deposits and lending by commercial banks.

#### 12.0 Real Estates and Business Services

The activity recorded a growth rate of 6.3 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to a growth rate of 5.6 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2010. The growth rate is attributed to increase in the overall weighted index of business services, rented dwellings and owner occupied dwellings. The index for business services increased from 203 percent in the second quarter of 2010 compared to 216 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2011.

#### 13.0 Public Administration

The activity recorded a growth rate of 5.8 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 7.0 percent in the second quarter of 2010. The growth rate is attributed to slight increase in the rate of recruitment of new employees by the government during the reference period.

#### 14.0 Education

The activity recorded a growth rate of 6.7 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 7.1 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2010. The growth rate was due to slight increase in the number of pupils/students enrolled in 2011 compared to 2010

# 15.0 Health, Other Social, Community and Personal Services

The activity recorded a growth rate of 4.1 percent in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 6.3 percent in a similar quarter of 2010. The growth rate is attributed to slight increase in number of patients attended in health facilities and improved other social, community and personal services.
