
## **HOTEL STATISTICS JULY, 2017**

The National Bureau of Statistics has initiated a monthly survey of hotel occupancy. Out of 184 hotels surveyed, 66 responded.

The occupancy rate for July was estimated at 49.6 percent. There were 164,644 beds occupied out of which 42.6 percent were by international visitors.

Further results showed that in the month of July the rates increased by 14.5 percent compared to the preceding month.

When compared with the same month last year (i.e. July 2016) the result shows that bed occupancy rate decreased by 1.1 percent as can be calculated from the table.

- > Bed occupancy rate is expressed as the percentage of the total number of beds utilized over the total number of beds available.
- Bed nights available are a function of the number of days in a month.
