HOTEL STATISTICS AUGUST, 2011


September, 2011

The National Bureau of Statistics has initiated a monthly survey of hotel occupancy. Out of 150 hotels surveyed, 61 responded.

The occupancy rate for September is estimated at 38.2 percent. There were 92,691 beds occupied out of which 47.7 percent were by international visitors.

Results further showed that in the month of September the rates increased by 1.0 percent compared to the previous month.

When compared with the same month last year (i.e. Sep, 2010) the result shows that bed occupancy rate increased by 3.1 percent as can be deduced from the table.

Note:

- The survey covers:-
 - All hotels on the Mainland with 30 or more employees.
 - Systematically sampled hotels with 29 employees or less.

The list used is comparable with that held by the Ministry of Tourism and Natural Resources. Provisional estimates are made for the hotels not responding.

- Bed occupancy rate is expressed as the percentage of the total number of beds utilized over the total number of beds available.
- Bed nights available are a function of the number of days in a month.
