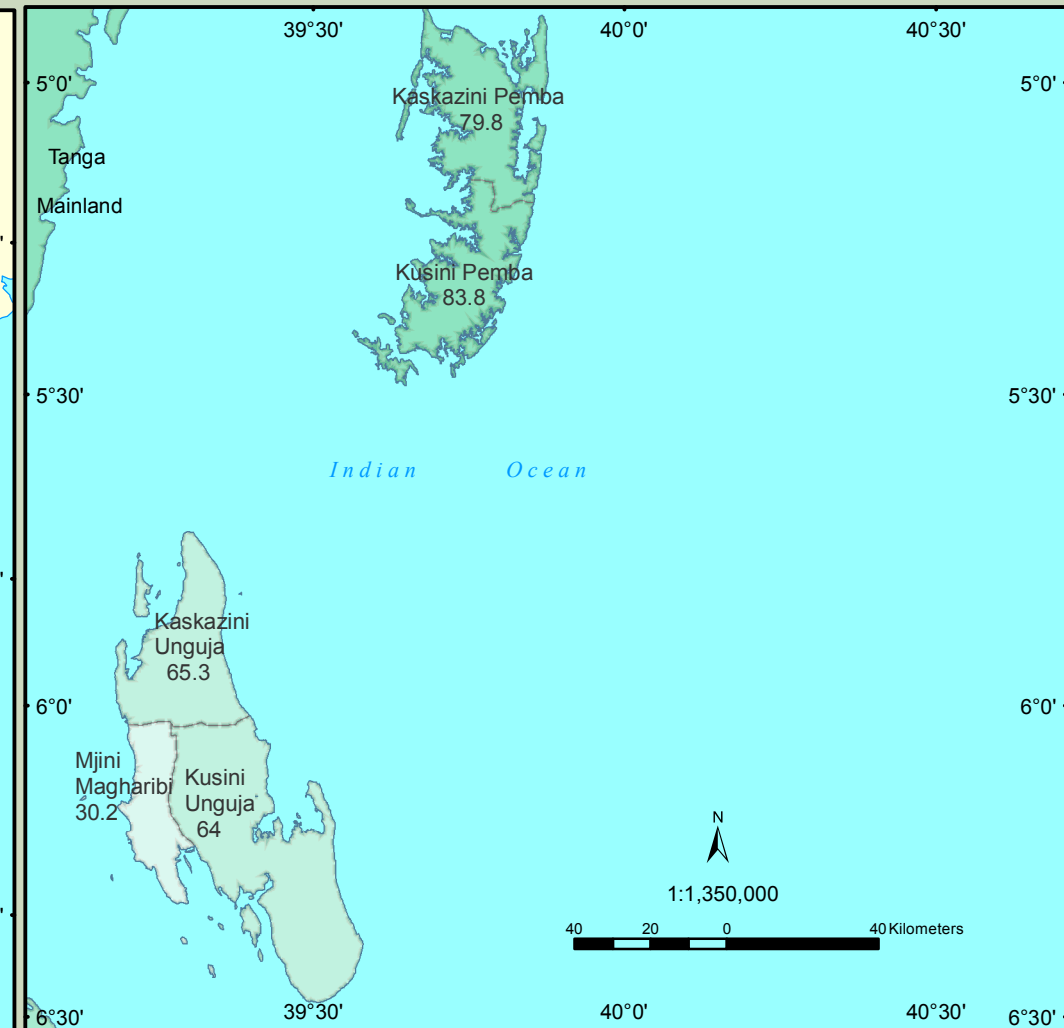
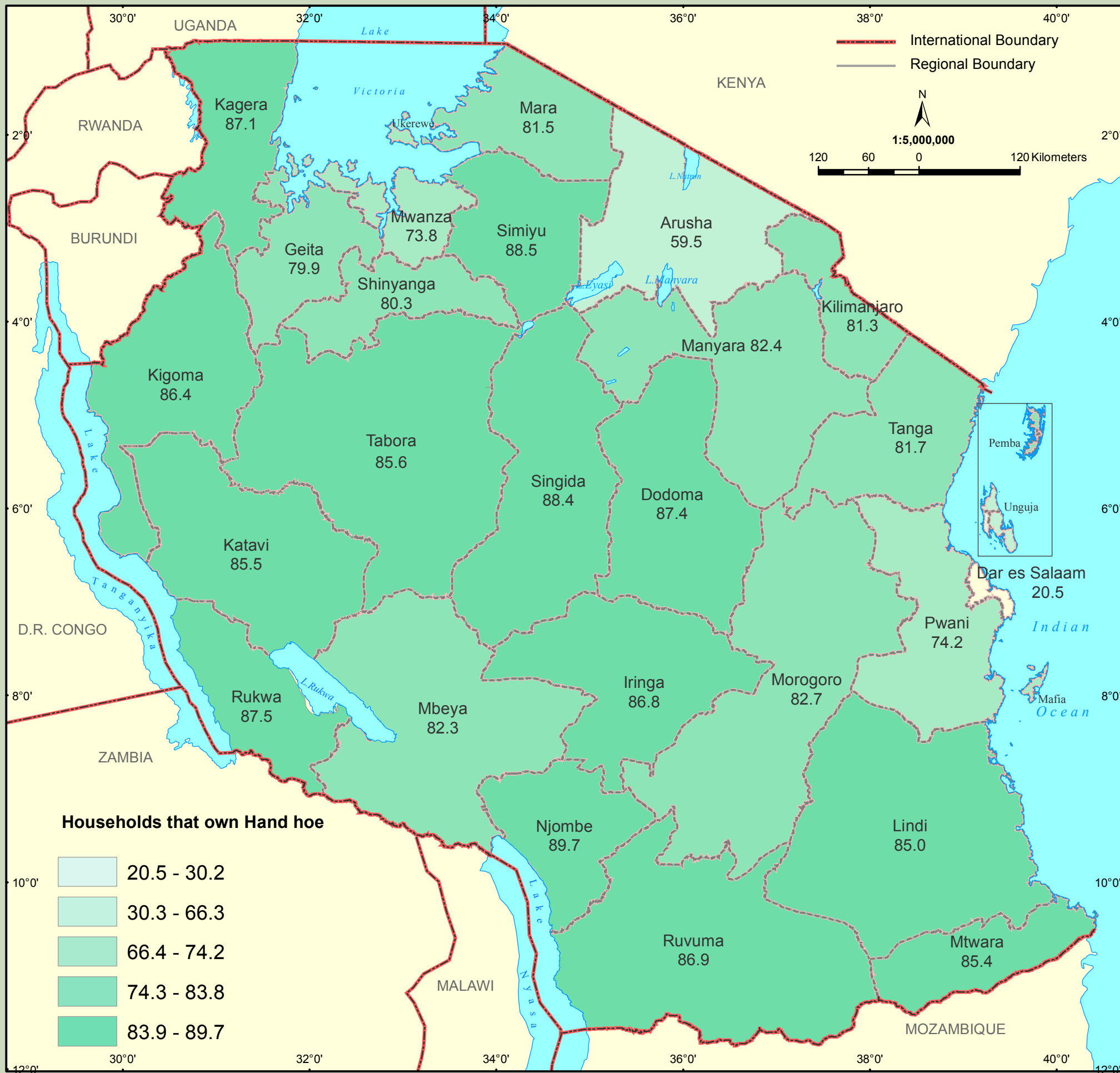


Proportion of private households that own hand hoe



It is acknowledged that most households in Tanzania are using hand hoe for farming. The 2012 Census reveals that 74.3 percent of households owned hand hoes. Dar es Salaam and Mjini Magharibi which are predominantly urban recorded the lowest proportion of households which owned hand hoe (20.5 and 30.2 respectively). Other regions recorded high percentages of households that owned hand hoes. Among the remaining regions, the lowest proportion of households was seen in Arusha Region (59.5 percent) and the highest proportion of households with hand hoes was Njombe (89.2). Other regions with high proportions are Simiyu (88.5) and Singida (88.4). The remaining regions recorded quite high percentages of households that owned hand hoe. All had between 60 percent and 88 percent of households which owned hand hoes.
