

Sex ratio





By definition, sex ratio is a ratio of males to females in a given population usually expressed as the number of males to 100 females. The overall sex ratio for Tanzania was about 95 males for every 100 females. The sex ratios for rural and urban Tanzania were 96 and 93 males for every 100 females respectively. At the regional level, Manyara recorded the highest sex ratio whereby males were in excess of females (101) while Kusini Unguja had an equal number of males and females (100). Othe regions which had high sex ratios included Geita, Katavi and Singida (98 each), Morogoro and Tabora (97 and each) and Pwani, Kagera and Mwanza (96 each). Regions which had low sex ratios were Njombe (88.0), Mtwara (89.0) and Mjini Magharibi (88.4)
