The latest figures for 2021 presented in this booklet for some indicators are provisional and some indicators were revised according to the NBS revision policies. Also, information in some tables is sourced from census and surveys which mostly conducted in a lag of ten or five years. The data gaps attributed to the census and surveys shall be filled immediately upon availability of respective reports.

Comments and suggestions from all stakeholders that may enrich the next edition of Tanzania in Figures are welcome.

WHAT IS NEW IN 2021

Pilot Census

In September 2021, the National Bureau of Statistics and the Office of the Chief Government Statistician (OCGS) Zanzibar conducted a pilot census for internal use. Ministry of Lands, Housing and Housing Development Ministry of Lands and Housing Development, Zanzibar Ministry of Information, Communication and Information Technology Union United Nations Population Fund-UNFPA US Census Bureau-United Nations Organization (IOM) were among other stakeholders engaged.

The pilot Census collected information through the main Census questionnaire and the community questionnaire. Along with these questionnaires, housing/building and physical address questionnaires were also included. The findings in this report are not for public use as only a few areas were covered in both Tanzania Mainland and Tanzania Zanzibar and were selected using specific criteria for a specific purpose. Thus, they cannot be used for any national plans and / or policies. This report is for improving the 2022 Population and Housing Census rather than being used as a reference for any policy plans or decisions.

During 2021 pilot census a total of 14,309 houses/building was counted in Tanzania Mainland and Tanzania Zanzibar in all selected enumeration area for 2021 pilot census. The result indicates 90.6 percent of houses/building are located in Tanzania Mainland and 9.4 percent are in Tanzania Zanzibar.



Economic Performance

The recovery in Global and African economic growth after taking some measures on the emergence of the Corona Virus Pandemic (Covid-19) that hits the world from December 2019. Average economic growth for some East African Community countries that disseminated GDP figures for the year 2021 through their websites show that: Rwanda's economy grew to 10.9 percent from a negative rate of 3.4 percent in 2020; Uganda's economy grew to 6.2 percent from a negative 1.5 percent in 2020; and Tanzania's economy grew by 4.9 percent compared to 4.8 percent in 2020.

Integrated Labour Force Survey 2020/21 Key Findings


The National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) in collaboration with Prime Minister's Office, Policy, Parliamentary Affairs, Coordination, Labour, Employment, Youth and Disabled have accomplished the Integrated Labour Force Survey (2020/2021 ILFS). The main objective of the ILFS survey is to obtain information on key labour market indicators which will be used in formulation, review, monitoring and evaluation of labour market policies and programs.

The following are some of key indicators of the labour market from the Integrated Labour Force Surveys (ILFS), 2020/21. The indicators are presented at the levels of the United Republic of Tanzania (URT); Tanzania Mainland (TZM) and Zanzibar (ZNZ) in respect of persons aged 15 years or above

Labour Force Participation Rate (LFPR)

The Labour force participation rate measures the proportion of the country's working age population that engages actively in the labour market, either by working (employed) or not working but available for work (unemployed). This indicator provides an indication of the size of the supply of labour available to engage in the production of goods and services relative to the population at working age in the country.


Labour Force Participation Rate by Area

The employment to population ratio is the proportion of an economy's working age population that is employed. The ratio provides information on the ability of an economy to create employment.


Employment to Population Ratio by Area

Social Institutions and Gender Index (SIGI)

The Government of the United Republic of Tanzania and the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar firmly believe that gender is an important dimension of development at all levels of society. For this reason, Tanzania embarked on a Social Institutions and Gender Index (SIGI) country study. This endeavour highlights Tanzania's commitment to investigate and understand the factors that still constrain women's empowerment and obstruct gender equality. SIGI Country Report for Tanzania provides an in-depth look at how attitudes and practices create gaps between women and men in terms of opportunities and outcomes, with particular attention to women's economic empowerment, intrahousehold dynamics and women's physical autonomy.

The SIGI Tanzania country study is conducted by the OECD Development Centre, in partnership with UN Women Tanzania, the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) and the Office of the Chief Government Statistician (OCGS) of Zanzibar, and in close collaboration with the Ministry of Community Development, Gender, Women and Special Groups of the United Republic of Tanzania and the Ministry of Health, Social Welfare, Elderly, Gender and Children of the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar.

The SIGI Tanzania aims to improve the rights and well-being of women and girls in Tanzania and to advance gender equality through the elimination of discrimination in social institutions. The purpose of the SIGI Tanzania is to build robust evidence on gender equality focusing on social norms and practices and to support national partners in strengthening national statistical and analytical capacities.

1.0 Background

Tanganyika became independent and a republic on 9th December 1961 and 1962 respectively. Zanzibar became independent on 10th December 1963 and the People's Republic of Zanzibar was established after the Revolution on 12th January 1964. The two sovereign states formed the United Republic of Tanzania on 26th April 1964.

The general elections held in October 2020 brought into power His Excellency Dr. John Pombe Joseph Magufuli from Chama Cha Mapinduzi (CCM) as the fifth President of the United Republic of Tanzania for the second five-year term. However, following his untimed death, in March 2021, H.E Samia Suluhu Hassan was appointed in accordance with the constitution of the United Republic of Tanzania as the sixth term President of the United Republic of Tanzania.

Dodoma is the capital city and Dar es Salaam is the major commercial city. The official currency is Tanzanian Shilling (TZS) and national language is Kiswahili, but English is also widely used.

2.0 Geography

Tanzania is located in Eastern Africa between longitudes 29^0 and 41^0 East, and latitudes 1^0 and 12^0 South:






4.0 Population




Population Distribution and Average Annual Intercensal Growth Rate by Region, Tanzania



Annual Population Growth Rate (projected) by Redion, Tanzania, 2021




Population Pyramids



Annual HIV Incidence using Lag/VL/ARV testing algorithm, THIS 2016 - 2017



Viral Load Suppression

Viral load suppression is a key indicator of treatment success in HIV-positive individuals. For the purposes of THIS, VLS was defined as VL less than 1,000 HIV RNA copies/mL of plasma among the population of HIV-positive persons ages 15 years and above.

Overall, 51.9% of HIV-positive adults aged 15 years and older had VLS (41.5% among males and 57.2% among females).





Employment & Projected employment for persons aged 15+ years from 2017 to 2021









Incidence of Poverty (percent) by Type of Poverty; Tanzania Mainland, 2017-18













Voluntary National Review (VNR) for SDG Implementation

Voluntary National Reviews (VNRs) are part of formal inter-governmental follow-up and review process on the Agenda 2030 presented at the United Nations High Level Political Forum (HLPF). They outline a country's progress report to its peers and other stakeholders at the global level on the implementation of the agenda 2030. The theme for 2019 VNR is 'Empowering people and ensuring inclusiveness and equality' and the goals under review are SDG 4-Quality Education; SDG 8 - Decent Work and Economic Growth; SDG 10 - Reduced Inequalities; SDG 13 -Protect the Planet; SDG 16 -Peace and Justice; and SDG 17 - Partnership for the Goals. Tanzania for the first time presented it's SDGs National Voluntary Review Report in July 2019. The Tanzania VNR provided a comprehensive review of six goals under review for 2019 and a snapshot of all 17 goals.

Tanzania also submitted the 2019 VNR Key messages to UN DESA on 17th May, 2019, of which results indicated that, Tanzania is doing reasonably well in goals 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8, 10, 16. Goals 7, 9, 11, 12 are likely to be achieved with stepped-up efforts. Goals 1, 13, 14, 15 17 will need significant local efforts and international support to achieve.



Capacity Building on Big Data for monitoring national, regional and global development agenda

The National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) in collaboration with DPs including UNDP Tanzania implemented a program on big data towards monitoring and implementation of Agenda 2030 and Africa Agenda 2063. Overall objective of the program was to support compilation of big data to enhance availability of real time data for the monitoring of national, regional and global development frameworks. The program is useful and relevant as it helped to enhance statistician's knowledge on the big data definitions, concepts and analytics techniques which are fundamental aspects of the big data utilization. Compilation of big data with special attention to quality issues will help to complement available data from traditional sources of data by providing real time data for real time decisions.

Following this exercise an Action Plan for Big Data Collection, Analysis, Coordination and Dissemination was prepared as a guidance of the process.
