The data gaps in this booklet that are attributed to the census and surveys shall be provided in the respective census and surveys reports as they become available.

Comments and suggestions from all stakeholders that may enrich the next edition of Tanzania in Figures are welcome.







- The Government received a soft loan of 1.3 trillion Shillings from the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to deal with the effects of COVID-19. The funds have been used in various aspects including infrastructure development in health and education sectors, as well as purchase of medical equipment and medicine
- Continuing with the completion of construction and renovation of referral, zonal and regional hospitals; construction of 59 new council hospitals; renovation of 19 council hospitals; and completion of 300 dispensaries.

- Increased student enrolment in higher learning institutions from 87,934 (2020/21) to 106,620 (2021/22) and 113,383 (2022/23)









NEW INFORMATION IN 2022

2022 Population and Housing Census

The Sixth Phase Government, under the leadership of H.E. Dr. Samia Suluhu Hassan has fulfilled its responsibility to conduct the 2022 Population and Housing Census (2022 PHC) as it was done in the previous phases. The previous censuses were conducted in the years 1967, 1978, 1988, 2002 and 2012. The 2022 Census was conducted in accordance with the Statistics Act, Cap. 351, which directs the Government to conduct Population and Housing Census every ten years. On the other hand, the Census has been carried out to comply with the United Nations recommendation that countries conduct a Population and Housing Census at least once in ten years.

The 2022 Census exercise was coordinated by the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) and the Office of the Chief Government Statistician (OCGS) Zanzibar in collaboration with various stakeholders such as the Ministry of Land, Housing, and Human Settlement Development; the Ministry of Land and Housing Development, Zanzibar; the Ministry of Information, Communication and Information Technology; as well as the United Nations Population Fund-UNFPA, the US Census Bureau and the International Organization for Migration (IOM).

The results of the 2022 Population and Housing Census will help in integrated planning, sustainable development of the country and more transparency in resource allocation to reflect the demographic balance of the population at all administrative levels. Likewise, the results will also be used by the Government and other stakeholders for monitoring and evaluating various national and international plans, such as the Tanzania Development Vision 2025 and Zanzibar Development Vision 2050; the Third National Five-Year Development Plan (FYDP III 2021/22-2025/26); the Zanzibar Development Plan (2021/22-2025/26); the East African Community Development Vision 2050; the Africa Development Agenda 2063, and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), 2030.

The Census results have shown that out of 61,741,120 persons counted in the United Republic of Tanzania, there are 30,053,130 males equivalent to 49 percent and 31,687,990 females equivalent to 51 percent.



The average annual population growth rate in Tanzania has increased from 2.7 percent in 2012 to 3.2 percent in 2022.

The Tanzanian population comprises a majority of young persons, where 42.8 percent are under the age of 15. The percentage of children under the age of 15 has decreased slightly from 43.9 percent in 2012 Census to 42.8 percent in 2022 Census.


Percentage Distribution of Young Population (0-14 years), 2002, 2012 and 2022

Population under the age of 18 in Tanzania is 49.0 percent which is similar to Tanzania Mainland but slightly lower for Tanzania Zanzibar which is 47.2 percent.


Percentage Distribution of Population (0-17 years), Tanzania, 2022

The percentage of youth population aged 15-35 has decreased slightly from 3.7 percent in 2012 Census to 34.5 percent in 2022 Census. A similar situation has also been observed in Tanzania Mainland. As for Tanzania Zanzibar, the percentage of the youth has increased slightly from 36.20 percent in 2012 Census to 37.03 percent in 2022 Census.

The percentage of the working age population (15-64 years) in the country has increased from 52.2 percent in 2012 to 53.4 percent in 2022. A similar trend is observed in Tanzania Mainland and Tanzania Zanzibar.

The percentage of elderly people (60 years and above) in the country has slightly increased from 5.6 percent in 2012 to 5.7 percent in 2022 for Tanzania and Tanzania Mainland. For Tanzania Zanzibar, the elderly have remained about five percent of total population.

The results indicate that Tanzania had 14,348,372 buildings, of which 13,907,951 (96.9%) were in Tanzania Mainland and 440,421 (3.1%) were in Tanzania Zanzibar.

2022 Tanzania Demographic and Health Survey and Malaria Indicator Survey (2022 TDHS-MIS)

The 2022 Tanzania Demographic and Health Survey and Malaria Indicator Survey (2022 TDHS-MIS) was the 7th to be conducted in Tanzania through the DHS Program. The 2022 TDHS-MIS was implemented by the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS), Office of the Chief Government Statistician (OCGS), Zanzibar, Ministry of Health (MoH) for Tanzania Mainland and Ministry of Health (MoH) for Zanzibar in collaboration with the President's Office, Regional Administrative and Local Governments; Prime Minister's Office (PMO); the; Tanzania Food and Nutrition Centre; National Malaria Control Program, Eastern Africa Statistical Training Centre, Sokoine University of Agriculture, and University of Dodoma.

The main objective of the 2022 TDHS-MIS was to obtain current information on health to inform policies at global, regional and national levels and to measure progress towards the Tanzania Development Vision 2025, Zanzibar Development Vision 2050; the Third National Five-Year Development Plan (FYDP III 2021/22 - 2025/26), the Zanzibar Development Plan (2021/22-2025/26); East Africa Community Vision 2050 (EAC 2050), Africa Development Agenda 2063 (ADA 2063), and the Global Agenda 2030 on Sustainable Development Goals (2030 SDGs). The 2022 TDHS-MIS will also help to assess progress made in improving the living standards of the people.


The following are the key indicators of the 2022 TDHS-MIS:

Total Fertility Rate (TFR)

TFR is the average number of children a woman would have by the end of her childbearing years if she bore children at the current age-specific fertility rates.


- If fertility were to remain constant at current levels, a woman in Tanzania would bear an average of 4.8 children in her lifetime.
- In Tanzania Mainland, fertility is higher in rural areas than in urban areas. On average, rural women give birth to 5.5 children in their lifetime, compared with urban women who give birth to 3.6 children.

Teenage Pregnancy


Teenage Pregnancy is the percentage of women age 15–19 who have ever been pregnant, according to the pregnancy history applied in the 2022 TDHS-MIS. This includes women who have had a live birth, women who have had a pregnancy that ended in an outcome other than a live birth such as a stillbirth, miscarriage, or induced abortion and women who are currently pregnant for the first time.

- 22 percent of women age 15–19 have ever been pregnant
- 16 percent of women age 15–19 have had a live birth
- 2 percent of women age 15–19 have had a pregnancy loss
- 6 percent of women age 15–19 were pregnant during the survey

Child Nutritional Status

- 30 percent of children under age five were stunted (short for their age), and 9 percent were severely stunted.
- 3 percent of children under age five were wasted (thin for their height),
- 4 percent were overweight (too heavy for their height).
- 12 percent of children under age five are underweight (too light for their age), and 3 percent are severely underweight.

Percentage of Children Under Age 5 Who are Malnourished



Trends in early childhood mortality rates (Deaths per 1,000 live births in the 5-year period preceding the survey)

Early Childhood Mortality

There are notable decreases in all three child mortality rates since 2010 TDHS. For example, the under-5 mortality rate decreased from 81 deaths per 1,000 live births in the 2010 TDHS to 43 deaths per 1,000 live births in the 2022 TDHS-MIS. Neonatal mortality decreased at the slowest pace

National Panel Survey, Wave 5; 2020-2021

The National Panel Survey (NPS) is a nationally representative household survey that collects information on the living standards of the population, including their consumption expenditure, non-farm income generating activities, agricultural production, and other socio-economic characteristics.

The term "panel" indicates that the survey will follow the population from the original sample over time to track the evolution of their living standards.

The NPS was designed to fulfil three principal objectives:

Firstly, to track implementation progress across the three clusters of the then National Strategy for Growth and Reduction of Poverty (commonly known by its Kiswahili acronym "MKUKUTA"). The clusters included: growth and reduction of poverty; improvement of quality of life and social well-being, and good governance and accountability.

Secondly, to provide a better understanding of the determinants of poverty reduction. The NPS enables detailed study of poverty dynamics (getting into and out of poverty) at the national level and separately for Dar es Salaam, Other Urban Areas. Rural and Zanzibar.

Thirdly, to assess the impact of public policy initiatives. The NPS can be a powerful tool in evaluating the impact of development policies and programmes implemented by both the government and non-governmental institutions.

The following are the key indicators of the National Panel Survey (NPS).

Households Welfare Transitions

- In Tanzania, less than half (42.6 percent) of the households in the lowest consumption quintile in 2014/15 remained in the lowest quintile in 2020/21.
- More than half of the poorest households in 2014/15 were able to successfully transition to higher consumption quintiles.
- Approximately three percent of the households in the lowest quintile from 2014/15 transitioned to the highest quintile in 2020/21.

1.0 Background

Tanganyika became independent and a republic on 9th December 1961 and 1962 respectively. Zanzibar became independent on 10th December 1963 and the People's Republic of Zanzibar was established after the Revolution on 12th January 1964. The two sovereign states formed the United Republic of Tanzania on 26th April 1964.

The general elections held in October 2020 brought into power His Excellency the Late Dr. John Pombe Joseph Magufuli from Chama Cha Mapinduzi (CCM) as the fifth President of the United Republic of Tanzania for the second five-year term. However, following his untimely death, in March 2021, Her Excellency Dr. Samia Suluhu Hassan was succeeded the presidency in accordance with the Constitution of the United Republic of Tanzania as the sixth President of the United Republic of Tanzania.

Dodoma is the capital city and Dar es Salaam is the major commercial city. The official currency is Tanzanian Shilling (TZS) and the national language is Kiswahili, with English also being used as an official language.





Population Distribution and Average Annual Intercensal Growth Rate by Region, Tanzania, 2002, 2012, 2022




Annual Population Growth Rate by Region, Tanzania, 2022



Annual HIV Incidence using Lag/VL/ARV testing algorithm, THIS 2016 - 2017



Viral Load Suppression (VLS)

Viral load suppression is a key indicator of treatment success in HIV-positive individuals. For the purposes of 2016-17 THIS, VLS was defined as VL less than 1,000 HIV RNA copies/mL of plasma among the population of HIV-positive persons ages 15 years and above.

Overall, 51.9 percent of HIV-positive adults aged 15 years and above had VLS (41.5% among males and 57.2% among females) in 2016-17.



Employment for Persons aged 15+ years, Tanzania Mainland, 2018-2022





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





Incidence of Poverty (percent) by Type of Poverty; Tanzania Mainland, 2017-18








