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QUARTERLY GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT SECOND QUARTER, 2012

1.0 Introduction

This report presents official Quarterly Gross Domestic Product (QGDP) estimates for Tanzania Mainland. The QGDP estimates do facilitate frequent and appropriate policy interventions through provision of reliable and timely reports on recent and short term economic development. The current quarterly Gross Domestic Product (GDP) estimates are subject to revision when necessary using the revised data from the field.

1.1 Economic Performance

In the report, the real growth rates are measured as percentage changes of QGDP for the current year as compared to the QGDP for the previous year. The real growth rate for the second quarter of the year 2012 is therefore the percentage change between the QGDP for the second quarter of the year 2011 and the corresponding GDP for the second quarter, 2012.





Figure 1: Growth Rates for the Second Quarter, 2002-2012

The Real Gross Domestic Product at market price is estimated to have increased at a growth rate of 6.9 percent in the second quarter, 2012 compared to a growth rate of 7.0 percent in the second quarter of 2011, (Figure 1).

In absolute terms, the QGDP for the quarter under review was 4,730,709 million shillings for the year 2012 compared to 4,426,905 million shillings in 2011, (Annex 1).


2.0 Agriculture


Agriculture covers production of food and cash crops, livestock, forestry and hunting. The activity registered a growth rate of 5.2 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to a growth rate of 5.9 percent registered in the corresponding quarter of 2011. The good performance was due to favourable rainfall received during the reference period in the areas potential for agricultural production and the government effort of improving production through provision of subsidised farm implements to the farmers.

During the period, quantity of maize harvested increased by 7.0 percent, from 3,246 thousand tonnes in the second quarter of 2011 compared to 3,474 thousand tonnes in the corresponding quarter for 2012. Paddy harvested increased by 8.9 percent from 415 thousand tonnes in the second quarter of 2011 to 452 thousand tonnes in the corresponding quarter of 2012. Millet/sorghum harvested increased by 0.6 percent from 333 thousand tonnes in the second quarter of 2011 to 335 thousand tonnes in the corresponding quarter of 2012. During the period, cassava harvested increased by 7.4 percent from 1,392 thousand tonnes in the second quarter of 2011 to 1,495 thousand tonnes in the second quarter of 2012.









3.0 Fishing

Fish production covers harvesting of fish from fresh water, marine water, rivers and dams.

Fishing recorded a growth rate of 4.0 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to a growth rate of 0.3 percent in the similar quarter of 2011. The growth was mainly attributed to an increased demand for fish and fish products both at local and foreign markets.



4.0 Mining and Quarrying

Mining and quarrying covers activity of extracting metals, precious stones and other minerals from the sub soil as well as minerals that occur naturally on the surface. It also involves polishing, pelleting and grading in order to add value to minerals.

The activity recorded a growth rate of 1.2 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to a growth rate of 5.6 percent in the second quarter of 2011. The lower growth rate was caused by the temporary closure of Geita Gold Mine on account of major plant maintenance. During the period, 9,819 kilogrammes of gold was produced compared 10,405 kilogrammes produced in the second quarter of 2011. In the same period, 36,434 carats of diamond was produced compared to 7,453 carats during the corresponding quarter of the year 2011.






Figure 3: Percentage Growth Rates for Mining and Quarrying; Second Quarter, 2002-2012


5.0 Manufacturing


Manufacturing covers processing of raw materials to finished or semi-finished goods. The finished or semi-finished goods can be for final use or intermediate input for further processing.

The activity recorded a growth rate of 8.2 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to a growth rate of 8.5 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2011. The increase in production was attributed to the reliable supply of power during the period which



resulted into an increased volume of manufactured products including food products, beverages and cement.





6.0 Electricity and Water

Electricity covers generation of electric power from thermal, hydro, solar, wind, biomass, geothermal, and biogas. Water covers supply of water from sources such as rivers, dams and wells for socio-economic activities.

The activity recorded the growth rate of 5.6 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to a growth rate of 10.3 percent in the



corresponding quarter of 2011. This growth rate was attributed to the increase in electricity generation. Total electricity generated increased to 1,385 million Kwh in the second quarter of 2012 from 1,285 million Kwh generated in the corresponding quarter of 2011.

7.0 Construction

Construction covers clearing of sites and building of infrastructure such as roads, bridges, dams, airports, railways, buildings and utilities. Construction may also include demolition of old structures for the purpose of building new structures.

Construction activity grew at a rate of 4.3 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to a growth rate of 4.9 percent in the second quarter of 2011. The growth was attributed to the increase in the construction activities during the reference period. The construction activities include the work in progress in regard to the construction of a bridge across the Malagarasi River, road construction from Nangurukuru to Lindi, Songea to Tunduru, Songea to Mbamba Bay and Singida to Babati.

8.0 Wholesale and Retail Trade, Repair of Motor Vehicles, Motorcycles, Personal and Household Goods

This covers purchasing of domestic manufactured goods and imported merchandised goods for resale. The activity also covers




repair of motor vehicles, motor cycles and personal and household goods.

This activity recorded a growth rate of 7.7 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to 5.3 percent in similar quarter of 2011. The growth was attributed to the increase in traded domestic manufactured goods and imports of merchandized goods. The index of deflated output for this activity derived from trade turnovers increased to 234 in the second quarter of 2012 from 217 in the corresponding quarter of 2011.

9.0 Hotels and Restaurants

This covers services provided to both domestic and international visitors. It includes accommodation services, food, beverages, beers and spirits served to visitors.

Hotels and restaurants recorded a growth rate of 2.5 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to 2.7 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2011. The increase in growth was attributed to slight increase in the number of domestic and international visitors in hotels. The overall international bed occupancy index increased to 186 in the second quarter of 2012 from 182 in the corresponding quarter of 2011. The number of domestic hotel visitors increased to 139,007 in the second quarter



of 2012 from 135,194 in the corresponding quarter of 2011. The number of international hotel visitors increased to 154,171 during the second quarter of 2012 from 151,109 in the corresponding quarter of 2011.

10.0 Transport and Communication


Transport covers transportation of passengers, handling of cargo and storage services while communication covers telephone, posts and courier services.

The activity recorded a growth rate of 15.2 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to 16.6 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2011. The performance was attributed to the increase in the number of passengers and volume of cargo handled during the period and increased airtime used by cell phone customers.

11.0 Financial Intermediation

This covers services provided by central bank, commercial banks, bureau de changes and insurance companies.

The activity recorded a growth rate of 14.1 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to 10.0 percent in the corresponding



quarter of 2011. The performance was a result of increased levels of deposits and lending by commercial banks and the services by insurance companies.


12.0 Real Estates and Business Services

Real estate covers renting of houses/structures for residential, commercial and storage purposes while business services cover provision of professional services such as accounting and legal services.

The activity recorded a growth rate of 6.6 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to a growth rate of 6.4 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2011. The growth was due to the slight increase in the demand of renting services and the increase in the supply of renting facilities during the reference period.

13.0 Public Administration

Covers provision of both collective and individual services by the government to the public. The government collects tax revenues according to law which is in turn used to pay for services provided.





The activity recorded a growth rate of 5.4 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to a growth rate of 6.3 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2011. The growth was attributed to the services provided by the government employees during the reference period.


14.0 Education

This covers services provided by public and private owned schools. It includes all levels of school from pre-primary level to higher learning level.

The activity recorded a growth rate of 6.7 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to a growth rate of 5.2 percent in the similar quarter of 2011. The growth was due to the increase in the number of pupils/students enrolled and the related services provided during the reference period.

15.0 Health; Other Social, Community and Personal Services

This covers services provided by both public and private owned health facilities. It includes dispensaries, health centres, district hospitals, regional hospitals, referral hospitals and the Muhimbili National Hospital. Other social, community and personal





services such as spiritual services and library services are covered here.

The activity recorded a growth rate of 4.5 percent in the second quarter of 2012 compared to a growth rate of 4.0 percent in the corresponding quarter of 2011. The growth was due to a slight increase in the provision of health facilities and improved other social, community and personal services to the public during the period under review.
