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PREFACE



The sixth phase Government of Tanzania, under my leadership, like the previous five phases, has fulfilled its obligation of conducting the 2022 Population and Housing Census (2022 PHC). Previous censuses that were conducted after the union of Tanganyika and Zanzibar were carried out in 1967, 1978, 1988, 2002 and 2012. The 2022 Census was conducted in accordance with the Statistics Act Cap 351, which mandates the Government to conduct a Population and Housing Census every ten years. The Census was also

conducted to meet international requirements for countries to conduct a census at least once every ten years. The 2022 census was conducted during the implementation of the 2020 UN Round of Population and Housing Census, which began in 2015 and will end in 2024.

The results of the 2022 Census are for integrated plans and sustainable development of the country and will help in increasing transparency in allocation of the existing resources to all administrative levels based on the available population. The Census data will be used by the Government and other stakeholders in monitoring and evaluating various national and international initiatives including the National Development Vision 2025 and Zanzibar Vision 2050; the Third National Five-Year Development Plan 2021/22 - 2025/26 and Zanzibar Development Plan (2021/22 - 2025/26); the East African Community Vision 2050; and the African Development Agenda 2063. Census data will enable the country to evaluate its progress in implementing the Sustainable Development Goals; goals that aim at achieving equality and eradicating poverty of all kinds including extreme poverty by 2030 by ensuring that no one is left behind.

The 2022 Population and Housing Census Initial Results publication is the first in a series of publications scheduled for release under the 2022 Population and Housing Census. The main purpose of preparing this publication is to inform the public on the total population of the country by sex and regions. This information is important as it will inform the public the demographic situation in the country, Tanzania Mainland and Zanzibar and for each region. Moreover, the trend of population increase, from 1967 PHC to 2022 PHC is discussed in this publication. The publication also provides information on the total number of buildings in the country, the types of buildings and the total number of buildings with physical addresses and social services.

INTRODUCTION

Population and Housing Census is a process of collecting, processing, analysing, evaluating, publishing and disseminating of demographic, economic, environmental and social statistics of all people and their residence in a country for a specific period. This process enables access to basic statistics such as country population by age, sex, marital status, disability status, education status, economic activity, housing status births and deaths and other statistics as specified in the Census Questionnaire (See Appendix A).

The main purpose of conducting the 2022 PHC was to obtain basic indicators of people and housing that will help in formulating policies, planning, monitoring and making strategic development plans aimed at promoting the welfare of the country and its citizens. Census results will help the Government and other stakeholders to monitor and evaluate the goals achieved in the implementation of development plans intended to promote the economy and social welfare of the people and ultimately reduce poverty.

The difference in the methodology used between the 2022 PHC and previous censuses has led to a higher quality of data in the 2022 Census. The 2022 Census used an advanced technology in all stages of its implementation including demarcation of Enumeration Areas (EAs) and enumeration. The use of tablets in all stages of implementation has helped in reducing operating costs, GPS recording in households and buildings, and collecting information from all community services; this has contributed significantly to improving the information collected. The 2022 Population and Housing Census has collected more information, where the Main Census Questionnaire had 100 questions compared to the 2012 census which had 64 questions. This is due to the great economic changes in the world as well as the increased use of technology that has led to the demand for statistics in the country.

The Government of the United Republic of Tanzania decided to implement the Buildings Census and the Physical Addressing Census together with the implementation of the 2022 Population and Housing Census with the aim of increasing efficiency and reducing costs. Building and physical addresses statistics are very important for the nation at large and for individual citizens in terms of housing and other important development activities. Buildings Census and Physical Addressing is an exercise that has been done for the first time in the country since the Union of Tanganyika and Zanzibar in 1964. Building's information was collected in national surveys held every five years to improve the country's planning policy.

Buildings and physical addresses statistics will enable the Government in formulating policies, laws, urban planning regulations and various development programs that are relevant to the nation. The 2022 buildings and physical addresses census will be used in self-evaluation for the coming years, as well as for monitoring and evaluating the country's implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and Agenda 2030 of UN-Habitat.

The fact that the placement of physical addresses is continuous, the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania and the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar will continue with the exercise of placing physical addresses and collecting information on all buildings that will be built in the country, in order to update the building database and physical addresses.

POPULATION DISTRIBUTION

Tanzania

2012 Census




Figure 1: Population Increase in Tanzania, Tanzania Mainland and Tanzania Zanzibar, 2012 and 2022 Census

The 2022 Population and Housing Census (2022 PHC) results show that Tanzania population has increased from 44,928,923 persons in 2012 to 61,741,120 persons in 2022, equivalent to an increase of 3.2 percent. In Tanzania Mainland the population increased from 43,625,354 persons in 2012 to 59,851,347 persons in 2022, whereas in Zanzibar, the population increased from 1,303,569 persons in 2012 to 1,889,773 persons in 2022 (See Figure 1).





Figure 3: Percent Distribution of Population by Sex

Out of the 61,741,120 persons enumerated in the United Republic of Tanzania, the male population is 30,053,130 persons equivalents to 49 percent and the female population is 31,687,990 persons equivalent to 51 percent. In Tanzania Mainland, out of the total population of 59,851,347 persons, the male population is 29,137,638 persons equivalent to 49 percent and that of females is 30,713,709 persons equivalent to 51 percent. On the other hand, out of the population of 1,889,773 persons enumerated in Tanzania Zanzibar, the male population is 915,492 persons, equivalent to 48 percent and that of females is 974,281 persons equivalent to 52 percent (See Figures 2 and 3).

Figure 2: Population Distribution by Sex, Tanzania, Tanzania Mainland and Tanzania Zanzibar, 2022 PHC

POPULATION TRENDS FROM 1967 PHC TO 2022 PHC

Figure 4 shows that, population in Tanzania has increased **FIVE TIMES** since 1967. The 2022 PHC results indicate that the population of Tanzania has increased from 12,313,469 in 1967 to 61,741,120 in 2022.

POPULATION DISTRIBUTION BY REGIONS

Administratively, the United Republic of Tanzania is made up of 31 regions; 26 regions in Tanzania Mainland and 5 regions in Zanzibar. The 2022 PHC results show that, the most populated region in Tanzania is Dar es Salaam with the population of 5,383,728 accounting for 8.7 percent of the country's total population. Apart from Dar es Salaam, other regions in the United Republic of Tanzania with populations of more than three million include Mwanza (3,699,872), Tabora (3,391,679), Morogoro (3,197,104) and Dodoma (3,085,625).

In Tanzania Mainland, the region with a population of less than one million is Njombe, with a population of 889,946 persons. On the other hand, each region in Zanzibar has less than one million persons (See Map 1).

Figure 5: Distribution of Population (in millions) by Region, Tanzania, 2012 and 2022 PHC






SEX RATIO


Figure 6: Sex Ratio by Region

Sex ratio for Tanzania and Tanzania Mainland is 95 males per 100 females while that of Zanzibar is 94 per 100 females. In most regions, the sex ratios range from 92 to 95 males per 100 females. Manyara region has a sex ratio of 102 males per 100 females indicating that there are more males than females in that region. Njombe region was observed to have the lowest sex ratio of 90 males per 100 females (See Figure 6).

INTERCENSAL AVERAGE ANNUAL GROWTH RATE


The population growth rate of Tanzania has increased from 2.7 percent recorded in 2012 to 3.2 percent in 2022. The population growth rate of Tanzania Mainland is the same as the National average. In Tanzania Zanzibar, the growth rate increased from 2.8 percent in 2012 to 3.7 in 2022 (See Figure 7).

The population in Tanzania and Tanzania Mainland for the year 2022 has been increasing by the rate of 3.2 percent and Tanzania Zanzibar, has been increasing by the rate of 3.7 percent.





BUILDINGS CENSUS

Along with the 2022 Population and Housing Census, the Government also undertook a Census of Buildings in the country.

NUMBER OF BUILDINGS

The results of the 2022 Building Census show that the number of buildings in the country is 14,348,372; 13,907,951 buildings in Tanzania Mainland and 440,421 buildings in Tanzania Zanzibar.

BUILDING CATEGORIES

Out of the 14,348,372 buildings in Tanzania, 68,724 are multi storey buildings, 13,540,363 are single storey buildings, and 739,285 buildings are under construction. The multi storey buildings located in Tanzania Mainland are 61,258 and 7,466 are located in Tanzania Zanzibar (See Table 2).

NUMBER OF BUILDINGS BY REGION


The results of the 2022 Buildings Census show that most buildings are located in Dar es Salaam Region (913,707 buildings), followed by Mwanza (868,430 buildings) and Dodoma (836,909 buildings). Dar es Salaam Region has the largest number of multi storey buildings (32,219 buildings) accounting for 47 percent of all multi storey buildings in the country (See Table 3).

BUILDINGS WITH PHYSICAL ADDRESS

Out of the 14,348,372 buildings enumerated during the census, 10,751,123 buildings, equivalent to 74.9 percent of all buildings in the country have physical addresses and 3,597,249 buildings, equivalent to 25.1 percent do not have physical addresses. In Tanzania Mainland 10,406,722 buildings accounting for 74.8 percent of all buildings in Tanzania Mainland have physical addresses. In Tanzania Zanzibar 440,421 buildings accounting for 78.2 percent of all buildings in Tanzania Zanzibar have physical addresses (See Table 4).

BUILDINGS WITH PHYSICAL ADDRESSES BY REGION


Census results shows that Kaskazini Pemba has the largest percentage (89.9 percent) of buildings with physical addresses. Other regions with more than 80 percent of their buildings having physical addresses include Mtwara (88.2 percent), Njombe (87.7 percent), Kusini Pemba (84.5 percent), Kagera (83.5 percent), Geita (83.3 percent), Ruvuma (82.7 percent, Simuyu (81.9 percent) and Lindi (80.7 percent). The region with lowest percentage of buildings with physical addresses is Dodoma (63.5 percent), followed by Rukwa (65.6 percent) (Table 5).

COMMUNITY SERVICES

Two days before the 2022 PHC enumeration, enumerators collected community services data within Shehia, Mtaa and Hamlet (Kitongoji).

HEALTH SERVICES

The Census results show that in Tanzania there are 676 hospitals, 1,466 health centres and 7,965 dispensaries. Within Tanzania Mainland there are 662 hospitals, 1,430 health centres and 7,680 dispensaries. On the other hand, there are 14 hospitals, 36 health centres and 285 dispensaries in Tanzania Zanzibar.

HEALTH FACILITIES BY REGIONS

Table 6 shows the number of health facilities for all 31 regions in Tanzania. Regions with more than 30 hospitals include Dar es Salaam (76 hospitals), Morogoro (44), Arusha (43), Mwanza (41), Mbeya (34) Kilimanjaro (33) and Mara (33). Regions with less than 10 hospitals include Katavi (9 hospitals), Mjini Magharibi (7), Kusini Pemba (3), Kaskazini Pemba (2), Kaskazini Unguja (1), and Kusini Unguja (1). Regions with more than 60 health centres include Dar es Salaam (154 health centres), Mwanza (103), Arusha (76), Morogoro (73), Mbeya (73), Dodoma (69), Kilimanjaro (66) and Tanga (64). Region with more than 400 dispensaries are Dar es Salaam (454) Morogoro (415), Tanga (412) and Dodoma (402) (See Table 6).

EDUCATION SERVICES

Table 7 shows the number of schools and categorised the primary schools and secondary schools. The Census result indicates that, there are 19,769 primary schools in Tanzania, among those 19,266 schools are in Tanzania Mainland and 503 schools in Tanzania Zanzibar. There are 5,857 secondary schools, among those 5,592 schools in Tanzania Mainland and 265 schools in Tanzania Zanzibar.

NUMBER OF SCHOOLS BY REGIONS

Results further indicate that in Tanzania Mainland, regions with many secondary schools are Dar es Salaam (350), Kilimanjaro (349) and Mwanza (330). Katavi (62), Rukwa (97) and Songwe (130) have the smallest number of secondary schools in Tanzania Mainland. In Tanzania Zanzibar, Mjini Magharibi region has the largest number of secondary schools (84) while Kaskazini Unguja has the smallest number of secondary schools (39). In regard to primary schools, Tanga (1,083), Mwanza (1,038) and Kagera (1,026) have relatively large numbers of primary schools in Tanzania Mainland compared to other Mainland regions whereas Katavi (266), Rukwa (394) and Songwe (496) regions have relatively small numbers of primary schools. In Tanzania Zanzibar, Mjini Magharibi region has a relatively large number of primary schools compared to other Zanzibar regions (See Table 7).

POLICY SUGGESTIONS

The 2022 Population and Housing Census is unique undertaking in the sense that it has been held in parallel with the Buildings Census and National Physical Addressing for the first time in the country since the union of Tanganyika and Zanzibar held in 1964.

At national level, the average annual intercensal population growth rate for the 2012–2022 period is 3.2 percent equivalent to the total population of 61,741,120. Out of the national total population, Tanzania Mainland and Zanzibar consists of 59,851,347 and 1,889,773 persons respectively. Regarding the Buildings Census, result indicates that Tanzania has 14,348,372 buildings, of which 74.9 percent (10,751,123 buildings) have physical addresses. In addition, results revealed that there are 10,107 health facilities and 25,626 educational facilities in different parts of Tanzania.

Policy Massage

The 2022 Population and Housing Census of Tanzania has revealed an average population growth rate of 3.2 percent from the growth rate of 2.7 percent recorded in 2012 Census. An increase in the population growth rate will have the following policy implications:

- a. The need to continue to increase the number of health facilities and services in order to match population with provision of adequate and quality health services with the aim of having a health society that can effectively participate in the county's social economic development activities;
- b. The need to continue to increase the number of schools and higher learning institutions and providing quality education with the aim of producing an educated society that will be able to engage in the labour market, both domestic and foreign;
- c. The need to increase productivity of food and cash crops as well as livestock and its products to ensure food security for the country's population and having surplus products for sale outside the country to enable the country to earn foreign currency;
- d. The need to continue building processing industries in order to increase the market value of goods and services both for domestic and foreign markets;
- e. Continuous development of drug and medical equipment industries within the country so as to reduce importation of drugs and medical equipment from foreign countries in order to save foreign exchange;
- f. Continued development of industries for building materials required in the construction sector in the country with the aim of reducing the costs of building materials for provision of improved housing both residential and non-residential; and
- g. The need to continue developing good master plans for urban and rural areas to make sure that all people live in a better and safer environment.
